
PHOTOGRAPHY AND CCFD-TERRE SOLIDAIRE

Since its beginnings, CCFD-Terre Solidaire has wished to use photography as a powerful tool to illustrate its actions throughout the world. A great number of collaborations have thus been made possible over the years. Today, our NGO has gathered a considerable amount of pictures, all of which are of great journalistic and stylistic quality.

By not capitalizing on human poverty, we intend to shed a light on men and women who contribute to change the world. Indeed, we use photography to illustrate our optimistic vision of the world.

We put in practice this editorial policy in all the issues of our periodical magazine *Echos du Monde* and *in* our partnerships with the press. It is also visible in the constant emphasis we put on photography in all our contents. The latest addition is the #JeudiPhoto, a weekly feature on our website and social networks that presents a situation in the world through the eyes of a photographer or the story of the picture itself.

This Prix is the outcome of the support we have shown to the art of photography over the years.

SEBASTIÃO SALGADO, FELLOW PARTNER OF CCFD, HONORARY PRESIDENT OF THE JURY

In 1973, Henryane de Chaponay, head of CCFD's project department, organized an emergency airlift with the CIMADE to bring assistance and food to the victims of hunger in the Sahel. Sebastião Salgado got on board one of the Belgian Air Force planes chartered to fly between Lagos and Niamey. He thus took this opportunity to initiate his first professional photo-reportage as he chose days before to leave his stable job as an economist at the World Bank.

On his return from this mission, CCFD asked him to use one of his pictures for the campaign "La Terre est à tous" (The earth belongs to all). Not having any idea of the value of his photograph he was selling for the first time, CCFD offered him more than 20,000 francs, a very large sum at the time which was indexed on the scales of professional organizations. He then launched himself as a professional by choosing to invest in quality equipment: Leica, enlarger... His first studio was later set up in an apartment made available by CCFD in a warehouse Villa St Mandé, Paris.

Salgado began his career working with major agencies such as Sygma and Gamma. He then became one of the most prominent photographer in the 1970s and 80s.

This story between Salgado and CCFD is about solidarity and friendship between extraordinary personalities, but also about recognition for artistic excellence. Finally, it is a story that reflects the vision of CCFD-Terre Solidaire, which has been consistently supporting many forms of commitment to a fairer world.

Grateful for the support that CCFD-Terre Solidaire showed him at the beginning of his career, Sebastião Salgado is now strongly committed to the Prix Photo Terre Solidaire as he has accepted to become its honorary president and helped to shape the Prix.

THE INTERNATIONAL AWARD FOR HUMANIST AND ENVIRONMENTAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Currently, there is no photography award dedicated to international solidarity.

This award originates from the will to defend the causes of CCFD – Terre Solidaire and to support the art of photography. It aims at highlighting committed photography, a powerful tool used to depict our world. The Prix also acknowledges the status of professional photographer and values the work of these fellow partners.

Our definition of Humanist and Environmental Photography embraces the vision of CCFD-Terre Solidaire which acts for social and environmental issues. This theme aims at depicting human beings at the very heart of their global environment and values the people acting for a more sustainable and fairer world.

THE CONCEPT

This award has three goals : **to acknowledge** a photograph's career, **to support** the continuation of their work and **to invite** photographers to join CCFD-Terre Solidaire in its commitment to a fairer world.

THE RULES

We have created this award to be a significant event organized every two years. Three laureates will be rewarded at each edition **for their aesthetic vision**, **their documentary work and their intention to pursue their commitment to Humanist and Environmental Photography**. This Prix is open to **professional photographers from all over the world** without any other condition.

Applicants are invited to submit a resume and their photographic project consisting of a series (begun or completed, as part of a long-term approach) and a documentary synopsis about it.

THE JURY

The project's partners will be in the Jury, such as actors of photography and people belonging to the world of international solidarity. For instance authors' societies, festival directors, publishers, members of global NGOs will be represented.

THE AWARD

The concept of the Prix is to reward the work accomplished by the three laureates but also to allow them to pursue their commitment by helping their work to circulate and gain visibility.

For the laureate of Grand Prix Terre Solidaire

A cash prize of 30,000€ to support the laureate's project presented to the Prix. The completed project will then be shown at an **exhibition** in 2024.

A paid mission for a **photo-report** on one of our abroad partners.

For the two laureates of Prix Avenir Terre Solidaire

A cash prize of 10,000€ each to allow them continue the project presented to the Prix.

A paid mission for a **photo-report** on one of our abroad partners. The series from these international missions will then be exhibited in various important cultural places at the end of 2023.

Finally, a book whose profits will go to CCFD-Terre Solidaire, will be produced and published.
